



# WEEKLY UPDATE ON NATURAL DISASTERS IN ASEAN PLUS THREE

## Indonesia

**Landslides claimed 30 lives in Indonesia.** As of 21 November 2025, the death toll from landslides rose to 30 people in two regions of Central Java, Indonesia. In Banjarnegara, the worst-affected region, 10 people were confirmed dead and 18 were missing, while, in Cilacap, 20 people were reported dead with three missing. Dozens of houses were damaged, seven people were injured, and more than 900 residents were evacuated. Rescuers continued searching for the missing.

## Malaysia

**Torrential rainfall triggered landslides in Malaysia.** On 23 November 2025, around 400 people were left stranded by landslides triggered by continuous rain in Wang Kelian, a village in the northwestern state of Perlis. All of them were safe. As of 24 November 2025, flooding brought by torrential rainfall affected 11,009 people from 3,839 families in seven states in Malaysia. The worst-affected state was Kelantan, on the border with Thailand, where 8,228 people were affected. No deaths were reported.

## Philippines

**Thousands evacuated as Tropical Depression Verbena approached the Philippines.** As of 25 November 2025, Tropical Depression Verbena swept across the Visayas and made landfall in Talisay City, Cebu Province, Philippines. More than 4,700 people, or 1,248 families, were fled from their residents overnight to the 57 evacuation centres before the arrival of storm according to the Cebu City Government's report. On-site classes at all levels in Cebu City were suspended, with schools shifting to modular and asynchronous learning until further notice. Local authorities were deployed while also addressing the aftermath of Typhoon Tino. Tropical Depression Verbena was expected to continue crossing the Visayas and northern Palawan before emerging over the western Philippine Sea by 26 November 2025.

## Thailand

**Heavy flooding devastated southern Thailand.** As of 25 November 2025, heavy rain triggered flooding in many parts of southern Thailand. The floods affected 2,196,758 people in 4,688 villages across 643 tambon in 98 districts within nine provinces. A total of 798,695 families were affected, and 13 people died due to the flooding. The Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation warned that the situation could worsen as heavy rain was forecast to continue in the lower southern provinces.
